# **People Helping People:**

"Back in November of 2020 we received a call on our helpline from a former Korean War veteran. He received a letter from the City of West St. Paul Code Enforcement department advising him to remove the graffiti on the wall on his property, requesting that it be done within 10 days. The problem was this veteran was in South Dakota helping his family with the harvest, and wouldn't be home until early December. He had no other family members in the area, nor had he even seen their graffiti. He reached out to BTYR for support.

A member of our BTYR went to the property and assessed the situation. The graffiti couldn't be scraped off without leaving significant marks. It could be painted over, but it was 4 feet high and 60 feet long, made of aged, porous limestone.

After taking photos and scrapings from the wall, we visited our favorite paint store. They matched the color perfectly and we covered the graffiti. The cover passed inspection by the city and they notified the veteran that the matter was resolved and thanked him for expediting the matter.

We never met the veteran, he never met any of us BTYR members, but he did call and leave a very nice message on our helpline thanking us.....that's all we could ask for." -NDC BTYR Board Member

## So what exactly is the Yellow Ribbon?

When you ask that question, you get a variety of answers ranging from "I'm really not sure"... "I think it has something to do with the military"..."It's a group that welcomes home veterans"... AND, "I don't know."

What those answers tell us is that we who are involved in the Yellow Ribbon need to do a better job of educating the public; especially to past and present veterans and their families.

**The Short Answer:** Beyond the Yellow Ribbon, "BTYR", is a national organization with cities that are sanctioned by the state to provide services to current and past military personnel and their families.

We are not the Veterans Administration and we are not Social Services, but we do have specific guidelines on how to operate and what we can and cannot provide.

This article will not explain in sufficient detail all of the things that a Yellow Ribbon organization can do.

**The Bottom Line:** We are here to try and assist veterans and their families in any manner that we possibly can. The optimum word is "try", as we're not able to do everything we might like, or specifically what the veteran or their family needs. However, we are associated and affiliated with multiple veterans groups and usually can refer the party to the correct source.

The public very rarely hears about anything that a Yellow Ribbon organization does; we tend to fly under the radar. Confidentiality is always optimum and the reward is that you feel good because it's the right thing to do.

If the brave men and women during World War II had not stepped up to do what they did, you would not be reading this. Simply put, the men and women that have served and continue to serve in our military provide the citizens of the United States with the privilege to do what we do.

We welcome inquiries. We welcome people who have an interest in volunteering. We welcome donations and contributions that all go to the support and benefit of veterans and their families.

As soon as it is medically safe, we invite you to attend our meetings. In the meantime, we invite you to participate on our Facebook page.
